

SUMMARY OF COUNCIL MINUTES – JUNE 5, 2023

GUEST SPEAKER: Paul Lovell is Executive Director of the Howard County Energy District. The HCED helps individuals, businesses and organizations save money through increased energy efficiency and alternative energy production. Paul explained how the Inflation Reduction Act offers financial aid to nonprofits when they install solar panels. Pay back is 7-8 years. The overall size of the solar panels is determined by the amount of electrical usage. The church has cut its energy usage by installing LED lighting and this means fewer solar panels are needed. Alliant Energy offers Net Metering which means credits can be accumulated and then used on cloudy days. Nonprofits do not receive renewable energy tax credits because they do not pay taxes. Instead nonprofits file with the Internal Revenue Service and they send a check to help defray the cost of the solar installation. Paul suggested getting 2-3 bids from contractors. Bob's Electric in Cresco and Perry Novak Electric in Decorah are local contractors. In Iowa 60% of our energy is generated from renewables. The goal is to get the USA away from fossil fuels and dependence on foreign oil, to accomplish sustainability and to practice good stewardship of our resources.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Between donations from church members and the Circle of Grace, no family will have to pay to send their child to camp this summer. Seven youth are going to camp and families will be reimbursed for the deposits they have already made.

The May Treasurer's Report: General Fund Ending Balance \$21,353.65, Benevolence year to date sent to ELCA \$5,284.75, Capital Improvement \$28,278.90, Checking Account balance \$73,745.26, Savings Account \$103,550.42, ILC Miller Fund \$289,407.01, Property Sales CD \$18,701.80 and Alvin Sommer CD \$12,403.43.

YOUTH AND FAMILY MINISTRY DIRECTOR'S REPORT: Adam Nelson said at the May 7th worship service, three graduates were honored and received tie blankets that reflected their interests. The Confirmands worked on their faith statements in preparation for their fall confirmation. There will be youth meetings June 11 and July 16. Vacation Bible School will be July 18-20 from 5:00 to 8:00 p.m. and the theme is Daniel in the Lion's Den. Preparations for the 2024 ELCA Youth Gathering in New Orleans are still in the planning stages but early registration in September means more and better options in regards to lodging, service days and transportation. Youth who are in 6th through 11th grades are eligible. Because they want to be active in the community, Adam and Kelsey will assist with the scoreboard at Crestwood sporting events.

Adam and Kelsey will be taking foster parent training on Wednesday nights this summer. As a result they will miss one night of Vacation Bible School and one night of GLOW.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS: Motion passed to give Malissa Kappes a \$1,000.00 honorarium for her past years of preparing the GLOW meals. An effort will be made to annually look at honorariums.

Motion passed to give Treasurer Alvin Voyna a \$200 gift card in appreciation of the long hours he spends as treasurer.

NEW BUSINESS: Motion passed to use the money from the Harold Hovey Estate to buy lumber for shelves in the new storage shed. Shelves will be installed prior to moving in contents. At the January 29, 2023 Semi Annual Congregation Meeting, Kenneth Lueschow and Vicki Grube were elected to be voting members at the 2023 Northeastern Iowa Synod Assembly. However, neither one can attend. Motion passed that Katina Wright and Mike Yslas be the new voting members at the Synod Assembly.

June Meeting Minutes, Continued

CALL COMMITTEE REPORT: Adam Nelson of the Call Committee reported the committee had interviewed Reverend Daniel Baldwin via Zoom meeting and by an in-person meeting. Pastor Baldwin is originally from Iowa, has been teaching at a Kansas university and his wife has accepted a job to be a professor at Luther College. The Call Committee recommended that the church council tell the Northeastern Iowa Synod it was interested in calling Pastor Baldwin. Motion passed that the Call Committee should continue in the process of calling Pastor Baldwin.

BOARD REPORTS:

<u>Stewardship & Finance</u> – Church finances are in good shape.

<u>Church Properties</u> – Everyone who uses the church must pay a \$150.00 security deposit and receive permission from the Church Properties Board. The Board requested further clarification on charges for janitorial services especially in regards to weddings. Cindy Yslas will check the minutes and update the wedding procedural booklet.

It was suggested that there be a dedication ceremony for the new shed and that a plaque be put up honoring Harold Hovey.

<u>Evangelism & Social Concerns</u> - Preparations for the Clothing Giveaway continue and posters publicizing the event will be distributed in the area towns.

<u>Parish Fellowship</u> – July 9th there will be a "Watermelon Feed" which will offer the church members a chance to socialize.

<u>Youth Ministry</u> – Upcoming events: Youth meetings June 11 and July 16, take tie blankets to children's medical facility in Rochester, Vacation Bible School July 18-20 and Lock-In July 21. Youth are asked to work at the Moo Mobile June 23 (fair), August 6 (Art in the Park) and August 26 (Borlaug Days). The Moo Mobile is a fund raiser for youth trips and the 2024 ELCA Youth Gathering in New Orleans.

YOUTH AND FAMILY MINISTRY DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Vacation Bible School will be July 18-20. Adam Nelson thanked the Immanuel community for donating most of the needed items. Youth who are in 7th through 12th grade this upcoming academic year are eligible for the 2024 ELCA Youth Gathering in New Orleans. A special informational meeting for parents and children will be held. Fundraising continues with youth manning the Moo Mobile at Art in the Park in August and at Norman Borlaug Days in September. Two hogs and processing costs have been donated for a Hog Raffle. There will be 8 winners and each winner will get ½ of a processed hog. Tickets cost \$25.00 and will be sold until August 13th.

A youth get-together will be July 21 from 5:30 to 11:00 p.m. There will be food, games and a campfire. Youth will be delivering blankets to the Ronald McDonald House where they will be given a tour of the facility. GLOW curriculum has been planned and now there is a search for teachers.

CALL COMMITTEE REPORT: The Call Committee extended a call to Reverend Daniel Baldwin and he has accepted the position as pastor of Immanuel and the pay package. He can move into the parsonage August 1st and he will go onto the payroll effective August 22nd.

LSI has responded to the love of Jesus Christ through compassionate service for over 150






