Greetings in the name of the Lord, Jesus Christ!

Brokenness is all around us. Whether I have encountered it in the news, the stories of those I am privileged to listen to, or the happenings of my own life there always seem to be wounds—some exposed and in the open, some hidden by attempts to keep them secret. Throw in the pressure that we so often feel from society, others, and ourselves to be "put together" and for "everything to be fine" and we have a good recipe for self-doubt, sadness, and exhaustion.

This can often bleed into how we live together as a faith community. We hold expectations of ourselves and others to be perfect or strive to maintain standards that each person sets for themselves, often forcing these standards on others. Judgment results, of ourselves and others, and judgment turns into lack of trust—in ourselves, in one another, and sometimes in God. We cling to what we have done before on account hindsight being 20/20 and our glorification of how great things used to be—as if we were not broken before—because that gives us a sense of security, though it be a false one. How can we expect ourselves to be perfect while we are broken? How can we expect our community to be perfect, in the various ways that we might define "perfect," if we are not willing to be authentic with who we are, how we are feeling, and what is going on in our lives and the world around us? Yet, we are afraid of exposing our brokenness.

In writing about the ministry with which we are entrusted as the people of God and followers of Christ, Apostle Paul writes:

"Therefore, since it is by God's mercy that we are engaged in this ministry, we do not lose heart... For it is the God who said, 'Light will shine out of darkness' who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Christ. But we have this treasure in clay jars, so that it may be made clear that this extraordinary power belongs to God and does not come from us. We are afflicted in every way but not crushed, perplexed but not driven to despair, persecuted but not forsaken, struck down but not destroyed, always carrying around in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be made visible in our bodies." ~ II Corinthians 4.1, 6-10

We are clay jars; we crack, break, even shatter easily. Yet the light of Christ shines in us and through us, even through our cracks, into the world. On account of this, not only can we face our own brokenness and the brokenness of the world, we can dare to be broken together. Together, with all of our broken and shattered pieces held together by the grace of God, we can be—no, we *are*—a community that reflects God's love into the world, not by our own power, but by the power of God that is at work within us. As a broken community, with our wounds exposed, we can and will experience the healing that comes only from God—the God of grace and love, the God of the cross, the God who creates life out of death. It is in our being community, our nation, our world.

TREASURER'S REPORT: The September Treasurer's Report: General Fund Ending Balance -\$1,799.93, Benevolence year to date sent to ELCA \$10,278.87, Capital Improvement \$22,054.43, Checking Account balance \$41,550.5, Savings Account \$103,563.12, ILC Miller Fund \$290,358.12, Property Sales CD \$19,049.58 and Alvin Sommer CD \$12,049.58. Motion made by Dick Holten and seconded to receive the September Treasurer's report subject to audit. Motion carried.

PASTOR'S REPORT: Pastor Dan reported that Confirmation (aka Faith Formation) has started. Adult education is being scheduled for Sunday nights starting Sunday October 22, 2023, at 6:00-7:00 p.m. in the church basement. Study of the book of Mark. September was spent doing a lot of hospital visits with church members. An attempt was made to contact all members who appear on the shut-in list. Was not productive. Will restart the Mid-Month Communion Service Thursday November 9 th . Coffee with Pastor Dan times are now available each week during the months of October and November. Call the office to schedule a time to chat with Pastor Dan as he gets to know his new congregation as well as an outlet for anyone in need of one-on-one time with the Pastor. Rick Nance has expressed interest in helping develop community gardens for individuals to grow their own food. Help would be in the form of locating land, teaching gardening, gardening tools and sourcing starter plants and plant seeds.

YOUTH AND FAMILY MINISTRY DIRECTOR'S REPORT: GLOW and Faith Formation have had a successful start thus far. There are new faces, attendance 20-25 and classes PreK to 6 th grade. 


YOUTH & WORSHIP BAND!!
