### IMMANUEL LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES – DECEMBER 7, 2020 - Page 1/3

President Kenneth Lueschow, Jr. called the Congregation Council to order December7, 2020 at 8:00 p.m. Present were Pastor Charis Combs-Lay, Vice-President Bob Omar, Treasurer Bob Gast, acting Secretary Gary Johnson and board members Lewie Perkins, Steve Johnson, Cindy Yslas, Dick Holten, Martha Rasmusson and Al Voyna.

**MINUTES:** Motion made by Al Voyna and seconded to approve the minutes of November 2, 2020. Motion carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT: General Fund ending balance \$15,929.13, Capital Improvement \$18,020.68, Benevolence year to date sent to ELCA \$12,762.52, Checking account balance \$46,149.28, Savings Account \$53,442.95, and ILC Miller Fund \$220,149.98. Question was asked about Board of Church Properties line-item Utilities-Parsonage. Synod guideline suggested that Immanuel Lutheran Church pay half of First Lutheran parsonage utilities expense since Pastor Charis has chosen to live at First Lutheran parsonage instead of Immanuel's. Utilities include gas, water and electricity. Expenses shown are for months of May – November. Currently, there is no signed agreement. Motion made by Dick Holten and seconded to receive the November treasurer's report subject to audit. Motion carried.

PASTOR'S REPORT: Pastor Charis said in November she had four Sunday worship services, no Mid-Month Communion service, has produced 3 Confirmation videos', has taken two COVID tests so spent 5 days in isolation, attended seven meetings: in-person Ministerial Alliance in Lime Springs, in-person meetings for Live Nativity, four, Bishop's Zoom Conference with Synod Pastors, Colleague group Zoom. Recorded contribution for Ministerial Thanksgiving Service. Thanks everyone for their contributions for this outreach service. Planned and recorded Christmas Eve Service for radio and Facebook. Wrote newsletter article. No in-person visits due to Co-Vid, but lots of conversations. Confirmation classes are no longer meeting in face-to-face small groups. Confirmation class and high school students are being recruited to help with Live Nativity. Pastor Charis asked to take the week between Sunday December 27th and Sunday January 2nd for vacation. Motion made by Cindy Yslas and seconded to grant Pastor Charis requested time-off Monday thru Saturday. Motion carried. Motion made by Bob Omar and seconded to grant Pastor Charis Sunday December 27th off with Synod providing a recorded sermon for the Church service. Motion carried.

**UNFINISHED BUSINESS:** Congregation President Kenneth Lueschow, Jr. participated in Church President's Synod Zoom Conference. President Lueschow, Jr. reported on discussion: majority time spent on COVID issues, some Churches have not opened, some Churches opened but since have closed, small Churches are experiencing severe financial losses, some Churches are having services in Church parking lot or outside on lawn, one Church has turned to electronic giving with incredibly positive results, suggested Churches need to be thinking out of the box, Synod Assembly will be first of June with assembly possibly being conducted virtually.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

a. Cindy Yslas Church usage:

Cindy Yslas reported on requests for Church building usage.

December 9th Wednesday Cresco Elementary PTO fund raiser will use Community Room to distribute cupcakes for delivery. Friday and Saturday December 11th & 12th Community Action will use Community Room to setup display of toys and have families select toys who were not adopted by another Christmas program in the County such as CARE and NEICAC. Monday December 14th Crestwood Elementary PTO will use Community Room to distribute soup, pies and cookies. (PTO took over the former Lions' Club fund raiser).

#### b. Live Nativity

Cindy Yslas reported on the planning and preparation for the Live Nativity drive thru. Immanuel Lutheran Church is holding a Live Nativity for the entire community ... to celebrate the birth of Our Lord, Jesus Christ on December 20, 2020 from 4:15 – 6:15 p.m. with a drive thru being conducted on the Church parking lot. An "At Will" and /or a non-perishable food item is being asked with all proceeds going toward the local Food Bank. Motion made by Bob Omar and seconded to grant approval to Immanuel Lutheran Live Nativity drive thru on December 20, 2020 from 4:15 – 6:15 p.m. Motion carried.

#### c. Tickets for Christmas services

Services will be 11:00 a.m., 3:00 p.m. and 5:00 p.m. Christmas Eve Day. KCZQ Radio will air Immanuel Lutheran Christmas Eve Service at 7:00 p.m. Motion made by Worship & Music Board and seconded that attendees will need to make a reservation with the Church office to secure a voucher to be picked up at Church office to be presented entering the Christmas service. Motion carried. At 11:00 a.m. Christmas service 100% masks required. At all services social distancing is highly recommended as well wearing masks usage is highly recommended. Motion made by Worship & Music Board and seconded that 60 persons will be given attendance at each service. Motion carried.

#### d. Plan of action if shut down

December 10th Governor Kim Reynolds will announce rules for the Christmas season. This may change Immanuel Lutheran Christmas services.

#### e. Gift to Todd at Sims

Todd installed our new sound system. Questions which arise during a Sunday Church service, Arlyn Grube has contacted Todd over the phone during the service to get corrective answers. Motion made by Cindy Yslas and seconded for the additional time Todd has given to answer questions that Immanuel Lutheran show appreciation with a \$100 gift card from Kwik Star. Motion carried. Bob Gast will purchase gift card.

#### f. Rent to First Lutheran

Included in the statement for utility expenses, was a request by First Lutheran that the rent received by Immanuel Lutheran from renting their parsonage, this rent be divided between the two churches. Motion made by Dick Holten and seconded that Immanuel Lutheran is not in agreement to dividing rent received from renting of Immanuel Lutheran parsonage. Motion carried. President Kenneth Lueschow will be in contact with First Lutheran concerning questions of concern expressed at this Church Council meeting.

#### g. Budget for 2021

Bob Gast presented proposed 2021 budget. 2021 budget is \$10,605 greater than 2020 budget. Motion made by Cindy Yslas and seconded to approve the proposed 2021 budget. Motion carried.

h. Set date for Semi-annual meeting.

Motion made by Cindy Yslas and seconded to set Semi-annual meeting for Sunday January 31, 2021. Motion carried.

i. Motion made by Bob Omar and seconded to grant a leave of absence for Church Council Secretary, Marlene Michel and to approve Gary Johnson as acting Church Council Secretary. Motion carried.

#### j. Sam's Well Drilling submitting check

Sam's Welling Drilling submitting a check for \$1500 honoring their employees who attend Immanuel Lutheran suggesting it be given to the Luther League. Motion made by Bob Gast and seconded to give the \$1500 to the Board of Youth Ministry for the upcoming Youth Gathering. Motion carried.

#### **Board Reports:**

Christian Education – Working to get Confirmation class and high school students along with their families to volunteer to fill needed positions for the Live Nativity being planned for December 20th 4:15-6:15 p.m.

Worship & Music – Need to scrape candles and other candle preparation needed for the Christmas Eve Service. Work to happen Tuesday December 15th. Poinsettia orders are needed by December 14th. Will arrange them. 7:00 p.m. Christmas Eve service to be broadcast on radio. A Christmas Day service will be held at 10:30 a.m. Take down of Christmas decorations will be January 10th.

Youth Ministry – Live Nativity has 10 -12 committee members working to find players. Valentines Day dinner will be decided later. First Communion (2-3rd grades) will be decided later. Confirmation Lessons will continue in spring if possible.

Church Properties Would especially like to thank Curtis Trees and Gifts for the Christmas trees and decorations they donate each year for the beautification of our church at Christmas time. Renting of the Parsonage has no issues currently.

Evangelism – Delivering wrapped gifts from Giving Tree on December 15th. Delivered food from cart to Community Action Corp. Delivery of meals to shut-ins will occur the week of Christmas. Featherlite has contributed 14 unwrapped gifts.

Stewardship – November 11th Stewardship Board met with Josie Hrdlicka, CPA, about possible protections that may be used to uncover or prevent possible fraud of financial activities. For protection of various organization Treasurer's and protection of Church, receipts need to be placed in a file folder to match each check written. Consulting costed \$100. Presently, will continue using Church member Audit Committee to audit books on a yearly basis. 2020 audit to be conducted in January 2021.

Parish Fellowship – Still have coffee in kitchen. No activities currently.

#### K. Personnel activity

President Kenneth Lueschow, Jr. excused Pastor Charis for the purpose to discuss the additional stress and Pastoral time spent by Pastor Charis caused by COVID restrictions and physical health of Church members. Motion made by Executive Council and seconded to give a bonus of \$500 for extended work during COVID. Motion carried.

#### Adjournment:

#### IMMANUEL LUTHERAN CHURCH SUMMARY OF COUNCIL MINUTES – JANUARY 4, 2021

**TREASURER'S REPORT:** Financially the year ended on a positive note. Only \$45.00 had to be moved out of the General Fund to the Benevolence Fund in order to keep our pledge to the Northeastern Iowa Synod to send \$15,000.00 to the ELCA. It was the consensus of the council to again pledge \$15,000.00 to the ELCA for 2021.

General Fund ending balance \$32,151.39, Capital Improvement \$18,735.68, Benevolence year to date sent to ELCA \$15,000.00, Checking Account balance \$62,507.07, Savings Account \$53,458.91 and ILC Miller Fund \$233,222.96.

**PASTOR'S REPORT:** Pastor Charis said in December she had three Sunday worship services, three live Christmas Eve services, one live Christmas day service and recorded a Christmas Eve Service for Facebook and the Cresco radio station. She thanked Jim Hughes for conducting the December 27<sup>th</sup> Sunday morning service and thanked the council for the Christmas bonus. She recorded one confirmation lesson in spite of Internet difficulties. She made phone calls to members on the death of Peter Olsgard (funeral later).

Pastor had three meetings with the Living Nativity group and two meetings with the Education Board. She attended the Ministerial Alliance meeting at Lime Springs' St. Paul Lutheran Church and Zoom meetings with synod pastors and the Upper Iowa River Conference.

The ministry of the Living Nativity for the entire Cresco community was awesome. Cindy Yslas coordinated the event and Vicki Grube put pictures on Facebook.

**UNFINISHED BUSINESS:** The musical accompanists Sarah Holten and Karen Lefebvre have contributed a great deal to the Sunday morning services during Covid-19. Sarah, Karen and organist Rick Nance are willing to present the special music as long as the congregation wants it. Motion passed to continue paying Sarah and Karen through March, to re-evaluate the situation at the April 5<sup>th</sup> council meeting and to pay \$50.00 to the one singer/piano player each time they accompany Pastor Charis during Wednesday Lenten events on Facebook.

**NEW BUSINESS:** It was the consensus of the Council to have the Semi-Annual Meeting January 31<sup>st</sup> and to alert the congregation of the importance of attending in order to vote on whether or not to call Pastor Charis.

Motion passed to pay Cindy Yslas a \$300.00 bonus in appreciation of all the extra work she has done for the church.

#### **BOARD REPORTS:**

Worship & Music – All the following are subject to change due to the Covid-19 situation. The World Day of Prayer will be March 5<sup>th</sup> and Immanuel is in charge. Ash Wednesday is February 17<sup>th</sup> and the plan is to be in person. The following five Wednesdays will be on Facebook, and Pastor will give a Bible study and a musician will accompany her. Holy Week will be in person. This year the Good Friday service is at Immanuel. All the Sundays will be the regular format.

Youth Ministry – There will be no Valentine's Day dinner. A postcard will be sent to the youth asking what service projects they are interested in. When Helen visits the shutins, she will take a postcard with a bulletin and ask the shut-ins if they need help. A letter regarding the July 2022 Youth Gathering will be sent to 7<sup>th</sup> through 11<sup>th</sup> graders. This is meant to determine the amount of interest there is in attending the gathering. Another letter will be sent to the families of 2<sup>nd</sup> through 5<sup>th</sup> graders in regards to First Communion. Via Zoom Pastor Charis will meet with confirmands (7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> graders) to check the status of their confirmation studies and to see if they would help the younger children with First Communion.

<u>Church Properties</u> – The board did plumbing repairs.

<u>Evangelism & Social Concerns</u> –Holiday meals using food from the Fall Dinner were taken to shut-ins. Gifts from the Giving Tree and gifts through Community Action for an adopted family were delivered. The board will take the donated food to the Food Bank when the cart is full.

The board called the Pine Ridge Reconciliation Center and reserved a spot in 2021 but the \$500 deposit was waived because everything is on hold due to the pandemic.

Stewardship & Finance – Al Voyna received council approval to join the church auditors as they audit the books in an effort to see how the treasurers of the various entities could facilitate the work of the auditors.

<u>Parish Fellowship</u> – The board will serve coffee and maybe treats in the sanctuary during the January 31<sup>st</sup> Semi-Annual Meeting.

**ADJOURNMENT:** The next board and council meetings will be either February 2, 2021 or March 1, 2021. It depends on the number of decisions that have to be made



#### A Path to Hope and Healing

Mike remembers feeling angry and depressed, and his family was at risk of falling apart. When he decided to start Therapy Services with LSI, he questioned the decision. Therapy wasn't easy and when he missed an appointment, he didn't want to go back.

But through working with his LSI therapist, Sherry, for the past several months, he has found ways to grow and heal. During each session, Sherry is there to listen without judgement, and she provides a listening ear for anything Mike wants to talk about. At the end, Mike is always given a type of homework or a lesson to think about until they meet again.

While they originally began meeting in person, Sherry has continued to be available through virtual therapy throughout the COVID-19 pandemic. The virtual sessions ensure Sherry and Mike can continue meeting regularly, on a flexible schedule and from the safety of their own homes.

"Thank God for working through LSI in-person and through telehealth, and especially for Sherry, who helps people like myself who have been lost for years. If I hadn't chosen LSI, I wouldn't have met my therapist who has truly helped me keep my family and stay alive," Mike says. "I look back at the progress I have
