When Your Church is Without a Pastor by Dale A. Robbins

It happens in every church sooner or later. Eventually, the beloved pastor that many looked to for spiritual guidance will depart for one reason or another. Occasionally, a minister may have the opportunity to devote their entire life to one particular congregation until he/she retires (or is promoted to Heaven), but pastoral transition occurs with far greater frequency in most churches. First, when it comes time for your pastor to leave, remember to keep your eyes on the Lord, not the person. It is understandable how people can become attached to their pastor. They are rightly viewed as God's representative to preach and teach His Word, a trusted counselor and friend, a father or mother figure of influence in our faith, a servant who sacrificed time and energy to love and care for us and our family. However, as remarkably important as God's servants are, we must always remember that they are merely mortals... and that our faith must be rooted in Christ alone, not in a person or any of His servants. To be sure, no one will ever truly be able to replace your departed pastor. They were a unique person and will always be one of a kind... BUT their position as pastor can indeed be filled again. God will have another genuinely unique servant that He will send to lead the flock of God. Pastoral change is not the end of the world. Change is a part of life, and although there will definitely be a need for some extra patience and flexibility by everyone in the congregation, you and your church will get through this...especially if you follow these tips:

- 1. Be Faithful to Attend Services
- 2. Be a Person of Prayer
- 3. Be Extra Patient and Understanding
- 4. Continue to Contribute Financially
- 5. Volunteer More than Usual
- 6. Help Contribute to Unity
- 7. Avoid Church Politics
- 8. Don't Waste the Opportunity
- 9. Finally, Don't Panic and Be at Peace!

SUMMARY OF COUNCIL MINUTES – DECEMBER 5, 2022

CALL PROCESS: Pastor Brackett of the Northeastern Iowa Synod is one of three people in the Waverly Synod office who are helping congregations with calling a pastor. Immanuel has completed the exit interview and the Certification of Completion. He explained the terms "intentional interim", "interim", "contract pastor" and "supply pastor". He spoke about the qualities a pastor should have and that candidates are vetted by the Synod. There are Synod Constitutional guidelines for calling a pastor and each congregation has their own unique constitutional guidelines. He said the ideal size for a call committee is 6 to 8 and the members should be diverse in regards to age, gender and socio/economic status. The congregation will have an opportunity to vote on the members of the Call Committee. Pastor Brackett will return to Immanuel at crucial times. They are always available to help.

TREASURER'S REPORT: General Fund Ending Balance \$18,549.02, Capital Improvement \$32,707.68, Benevolence year to date sent to ELCA \$14,578.95, Checking Account balance \$72,460.84, Savings Account \$103,505.75 and ILC Miller Fund \$269,963.76.

YOUTH AND FAMILY MINISTRY DIRECTOR'S REPORT: Adam Nelson's report stated there is a youth cookie making fundraiser on Saturday December 17th. Youth will also be making tie blankets for the four senior youth at Immanuel and for the Ronald McDonald House in Rochester. There are plans for snow tubing at Stewartville, Minnesota. GLOW and Confirmation youth have decided to have the Noisy Offering go towards the Mayo Clinic Children's Center in Rochester. The Synod has already begun planning for the 2024 National Youth Gathering in New Orleans.

NEW BUSINESS: The Board of Church Properties wishes to increase their 2023 budget because of rising insurance costs, property taxes and church utilities. The Board of Parish Fellowship wishes to increase their 2023 budget because the church now furnishes the donuts and cookies for Sunday morning fellowship from \$350 up to \$1,000. Board of Worship & Music is reducing the budget for Professional Resources from \$1,600 down to \$1,300 and Substitute Musicians from \$1,700 down to \$1,000.

Immanuel pledged to give the ELCA \$16,000 in 2022 for benevolence. To date the offering collected for benevolence is \$14,578.95. The church voted to meet the pledge and make up the difference. Then the council pledged \$15,500 to the ELCA for benevolence in 2023.

The council reviewed the guidelines for a Call Committee as set out in the Constitution.

The church received a check for \$16,027.70 from the Alvin Sommer Estate. Motion passed to check with relatives if they have any special wishes and then eventually to put it into a certificate of deposit.

A bid has been received for Wi-Fi and security cameras in the church and the council voted to spend \$3,800 plus tax for Wi-Fi and security cameras and to take the money out of the newly received Alvin Sommer bequest.

BOARD REPORTS: Church Properties – The board got the Christmas trees from Curtis and a door lock has been installed on the inside door of the education unit. There is loose carpet by the altar and it will be patched. In regards to the west lot recently sold to Louis and Lisa Lienhard, four trees have been planted on the lot line and the church's snow removal cost has been reduced by \$20 per removal.

SUMMARY OF COUNCIL MINUTES – JANUARY 9, 2023

TREASURER'S REPORT: General Fund Ending Balance \$40,250.27, Capital Improvement \$33,387.68, Benevolence year to date sent to ELCA \$16,267.37, Checking Account balance \$91,712.61, Property Sales CD \$18,701.80, Savings Account \$103,550.42 and ILC Miller Fund \$284,254.13. Our share of the First Lutheran Parsonage expense was large in December due to First Lutheran not sending a bill and it will be the final bill.

YOUTH AND FAMILY MINISTRY DIRECTOR'S REPORT: Adam Nelson said the Christmas Children's Program went well and about 15 youth volunteered at the Live Nativity. GLOW and Confirmation youth had games and a movie for the end-of-the-year Pajama and Pancake Night. GLOW and Confirmation will resume on January 11th and the curriculum has been modified so that the elementary-age lessons will be less complicated. There are plans for snow tubing at Stewartville, Minnesota and bowling in Decorah. Scholarships will be available. Wendy Johnson has volunteered to be in charge of the Valentine's Dinner December 11th.

NEW BUSINESS:

There was an unexpected extra charge of over \$1,600.00 per month from Portico for Pastor Charis' insurance due to her filing for disability. We are required to pay this for two months which will be for December and January.

There will have to be either a special meeting or email confirmation of the Council to approve nominees for the Call Committee and to approve the agenda for the Semi-Annual Meeting January 29th.

Due to comments from the congregation, there was a discussion about the height and location of the Christmas tree which has been by the pulpit and under the projected image on the wall. The tall tree covers the projection in places for those that sit on the west side of the church especially when sitting closer to the front. A couple of suggestions were to move the tree to the east side or have a shorter tree.

Martha Rasmusson brought up for discussion the proposal to establish a new position with compensation for the GLOW meal coordinator.

Another proposal for discussion was having the boards meet at 6:30 p.m. and the council meet at 7:00 p.m. Currently it is 7:00 and 8:00. It was mutually agreed upon by the council to try the new times to allow the council members to leave at an appropriate time.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

The Endowment/Memorial Committee proposed spending \$1,710.00 of Endowment interest as follows: Howard County Food Pantry \$500.00, EWALU Bible Camp \$400.00, Riverside Bible Camp \$300.00, ELCA water projects \$510.00. Motion passed to approve the distribution of Endowment interest as proposed by the Endowment/Memorial Committee.

BOARD REPORTS: None.

ADJOURNMENT: The next council meeting is February 6, 2023 at 7:00 p.m.

A Journey of Overwhelming Joy


After going through fertility treatments and being told they weren't able to have any more kids, Dani and her husband pursued their foster care license in 2015 and have cared for 13 kids since. "Throughout our journey of being foster parents, we've had many great placements," said Dani. "Our shortest placement lasted five days when we cared for a girl, whose mother was incapable of watching her while she recovered in the hospital, and our longest lasted 18 months."

Dani shared that one of their biggest blessings was having the opportunity to adopt some of the children they fostered. The family adopted their first child at age one, and they had plans to adopt another when the child turned 18 years old.

"Every time our family adopts another child, I get the same feeling of overwhelming joy," said Dani. "I feel like any expectant mom –not being able to contain my joy when their adoption comes up, and telling everyone I know about it." Dani shared that it is hard to explain the full impact fostering – and the lows and highs it brings – has had on her family. "We've cried, stressed and lost a lot of sleep. We loved, laughed and had so many firsts," said Dani. "But I still tell everyone who is considering being a foster parent to do it. It's a roller coaster, but so worth it."


