

SUMMARY OF COUNCIL MINUTES – OCTOBER 3, 2022

TREASURER'S REPORT: General Fund Ending Balance \$6,298.40, Capital Improvement \$31,727.68, Benevolence year to date sent to ELCA \$10,253.58, Checking Account balance \$58,162.32, Savings Account \$103,505.75 and ILC Miller Fund \$284,020.13.

PASTOR'S REPORT: Pastor Charis reported her pastoral acts in September included: four Sunday worship services, one funeral, three GLOW sessions, three text studies, the Upper Iowa Conference Pastors Monthly Meeting, six miscellaneous meetings and four visits. She also hosted the September Ministerial Alliance Meeting.

Upcoming events include the wedding of Amber Hinck and Brady Vrieze October 8th and the baptism of Zoey Stephenson October 16th. First Communion practice is October 26th and the participating youth may have their First Communion with the congregation at the All Saints Celebration November 13th. The following youth have turned in their faith statements and will be confirmed on October 30th: Kenzie Moellers, Eden Rasmusson, Brennan Van Dyke, Alden Shaw, Kayli Hinck and Peyton Johnson. There may be other recipients because Covid has caused some disruptions.

Pastor Charis explained the ELCA policy in regards to a former pastor retiring in the community in which she served. She cannot be a member of Immanuel and must transfer her membership. She can socialize with Immanuel members and attend weddings and funerals at the church. However, there must be no conversations about church affairs.

Pastor Charis' official retirement date is November 15th and she cannot take on any new duties. However, with a vote by the council she may officiate at the wedding of Tanya Lueschow and Tyler Driver. She has had all the necessary pre-wedding meetings with them. Motion passed to allow Pastor Charis Combs-Lay to officiate at the wedding of Tanya Lueschow and Tyler Driver December 10, 2022.

YOUTH AND FAMILY MINISTRY DIRECTOR'S REPORT: Adam Nelson reported GLOW and Confirmation have begun but are short one teacher. The Noisy Offering at the Wednesday night worship service will go towards helping to build a Water Purification System through Lutheran World Relief. Malissa Kappes will create a chart to show the progress of the fundraising. Upcoming events include a youth meeting October 16th, a Middle School Lock-In at the University of Northern Iowa, Trunk or Treat at the Fitness Center and helping with the Fall Dinner in November.

Adam and Kelsey work together with the Christian Education and Youth boards.

COMMITTEE REPORTS: Motion passed to approve the distribution of Endowment interest as proposed by the Endowment/Memorial Committee. Endowment expenditures: CARE/Christmas in Cresco \$500.00, Don Davis Fund \$200.00, Midwest Mission \$200.00, Wings of Refuge (sex trafficking) \$447.00 and Young Adults in Global Mission \$400.00. Total is \$1.747.00.

Posters advertising the Fall Dinner are available for distribution around the community. The plan is to serve 700 people.

BOARD REPORTS:

<u>Church Properties</u> – The board fixed a church-sanctuary window and discussed planting trees on the property line with the Lienhards who are in the process of buying the west lot.

<u>Evangelism & Social Concerns</u> – The board will put up a sign on the Food Pantry cart to not bring outdated food.

<u>Christian Education</u> - Youth Sunday is November 20th. Upcoming events are Trunk or Treat at the Fitness Center, raking leaves and the Christmas Holiday Parade. The Live Nativity setup is December 3rd and the event is December 4th. The Christmas play practice is November 30th and December 7th. The play is 11:00 a.m. December 11th after Sunday worship service and coffee fellowship. In 2023 there are plans for snow tubing, Valentine's Day Dinner and "Souper Bowl" (fundraiser for the hungry).

<u>Youth Ministry</u> – Preparations for Confirmation include robes, photographer, flowers, cake, etc. Fall Dinner duties include preparation, serving and cleanup. There are plans for a movie night with a portable screen, an Easter Egg Hunt and a Carnival Day in the spring. Four seniors are graduating from high school this spring. Youth will tie blankets for the seniors and the Ronald McDonald House.

Worship & Music – The box for candles used on All Saints Day will be prepared and prices for poinsettias will be acquired.

Stewardship & Finance – The abstract for the church's lot at the corner of 2nd Avenue West and 4th Street West has been updated and the sale of the lot to Louis and Lisa Lienhard will soon happen.

<u>Parish Fellowship</u> – During the month of October there will be a standing order of donuts at Kwik Star and in November cookies may be part of the order. The weekly cost of donuts is \$18. Volunteers can still sign up to furnish the treats, make the coffee, serve and clean up.

NEW BUSINESS: There will be a farewell event hosted by the Parish Fellowship Committee for retiring Pastor Charis Combs-Lay. Leonard Zeller will be asked to use his woodworking skills to make a gift. The Council will nominate a Call Committee and appoint people after November 15th. The church does not have to pay Pastor Charis for her unused vacation but the Synod says she must be paid for the Continuing Education because it has been budgeted for. Steve Brackett of the Northeastern Iowa Synod will meet with the Council after the Call Committee is finalized.

This is a summary of minutes of the October council meeting. Full minutes will be available after formal approval by council at the next meeting.


